Partnership Agreement	This project is the fruit of a partnership between CSM, the Ministry of Education and other non-profit organizations that work with disadvantaged children.
Relevance of the project	<p>In Morocco's public schools, the deliverance of language classes is compromised by many factors such as crowded classrooms and lack of trained teacher due to an overall low education level especially when it comes to English. Private summer lessons are of course available but too expansive for most families. This is where you can play your part. Indeed, volunteers coming from abroad remain the best option to deliver these children a good quality and free service and we believe that you and them will gain from this international experience.</p> <p>CSM has chosen the district of Sbata to carry out the summer scholar support project because help is really needed in this area.</p> <p>CSM Summer School offers disadvantaged children the opportunity to strengthen their French and English skills in order to give them the possibility to attend university after they finish high school. Indeed, courses in Moroccan universities are taught only in French therefore excluding automatically all children who went to public schools and did not received a sufficient education in languages.</p>

What is the aim of this project?	The aim of this work camp is to reinforce the language competences of children and young adults with few opportunities. We would like to gather both Moroccans and international volunteers so that not only the students but also the teachers benefit from the intercultural exchange.

Geographical context of the project	<p>Casablanca, in Arabic “Dar El Baida”, is the biggest city and business center of Morocco and of the entire Maghreb region. Economically and demographically speaking, it is one of the most important cities of Africa as it is one of the most developed financial centers of the continent. It is also one of the largest artificial ports in the world and the primary naval base of the Moroccan Navy.</p> <p>The Hassan II Mosque, completed in 1993 after many years of construction, is among Africa’s largest ones and its minaret is among the tallest in the world. This building really is one of the jewels of Morocco, as it is built on the seafront and its minaret is equipped with a laser that beams toward Mecca. What makes it even more special is the fact that it is one of the only mosques allowing non-Muslims visitors into its halls.</p>		

	<p>Casablanca's central market is small and manageable. White-walled stalls with green clay tile roofs dotted with foliage are dreamed Instagram material. You will find any kind of produce, namely nuts, dates and argan oil, the traditional Moroccan elixir. Linger long enough and eventually you will see the vendors line up for the call of prayer, you can then join them for a quick tagine lunch.</p> <p>The Aïn-Diab coast (seaside annex of the city) is a traditional evening meeting point for locals, especially on weekends. You can find plenty of trendy restaurants and popular pubs; some of them are even there since the 30's and offer seawater swimming pools.</p>

Arrival possibilities and meeting point	<p>The ideal meeting point is at Casa Voyageur train station (but we can also arrange a meeting at Ain Sbaa train station).</p> <p>Casablanca is the first international airport of the country. From there you can easily catch a train to Casa Voyageur train station that will cost about 3 and a half euros. Remember you can only pay in dirham, the local currency, so please don't forget to change money inside the airport. A taxi to the train station should cost 20 to 30 euros.</p> <p>If you happen to fly into another airport of the country, train connections run very often as it is the biggest city. You can check the prices and timetables here http://www.oncf.ma/Pages/Accueil.aspx <u>You can also get a bus, which is usually a cheaper option but not all bus companies have website. <p>Accommodation Details</p>	<p>The male volunteers will be accommodated in the school and the female volunteers will be living with a host family living within a 10 min walking distance of the school. Thanks to our agreement with the Ministry of Education we are authorized to use the classrooms to accommodate the volunteers. The rooms will be set up with mats and blankets but we highly recommend the volunteers to bring sleeping bags with them.</p> <p>Important highlights: Toilets in Morocco are usually Turkish bath style. For the male volunteer, there won't be a normal shower, only a hose they can use to clean themselves. However, in summer Casablanca can reach 32 degrees so the water comes out warm anyway.</p> <p>International volunteers can also ask the national ones to show them the Hammam (public baths). Actually, you should try it once at least, it is indeed a very relaxing and enjoyable experience and has many virtues for the skin.</p>

Partnership Agreement	This project is the fruit of a partnership between CSM and the Ministry of Youth and Sport.
Aim of this project	The aim of this project is to contribute to the improvement of the host center through the following activities: painting, cleaning and gardening.
More info about the project	<p>We decided to create this project because this host center clearly needs to be refreshed. The facilities' structure in itself is in a good state but from the outside it looks almost abandoned. This community host center does not receive enough funding to invest in superficial renovations such as painting and building green spaces, even though it would radically changed the atmosphere for its residents. Our agreement is the following: with their subsidies they buy the materials and we provide the volunteers to spare them the cost of working labour.</p> <p>Apart from every activity related to the renovation and brighten-up of the host center, the volunteers will have the opportunity to get in touch with locals and involve in other activities related with Moroccan habits and ay of</p>

	<p>life.</p> <p>The general organization and responsibility of the work camp falls upon a camp leader who can also propose an animation program to the participants for their spare-times, such as visits of places of interest in the surrounding area, artistic or physic activities, etc. Of course the volunteers are free to do what they wish with their free time and suggest any other activity to the group.</p>
<p>Main Context of the Activity</p>	<p>This work camp is designed to gather both national and international volunteers so that everyone will be able to appreciate the everyday life habits and culture of the others through practical and social involvement and learn from the intercultural exchange. By getting in touch with national volunteers and social workers in the center, the ones coming from abroad can actually get involved in the community, not only inside the center but also outside, when they finish work.</p> <p>Larache is an important harbour town in the region of Tanger – Tetuan – Al Hoceima, in the North of Morocco. The climate can be described as Mediterranean although there is heavier rainfall. The summers are moderately hot and sunny - ideal for the city's beaches - and the winters are wet and cool.</p> <p>Larache has excellent road connections to other urban centres: Asilah is 33 km north, Tangier 80 km north, Kenitra 110 km south and Rabat 150 km south.</p> <p>Larache has two centres: the old quarters and the Spanish town. It features many examples of interesting architecture, although much of it is poorly conserved, and it is not a huge tourist destination. Across the river you will find one of Morocco's finest beaches.</p> <p>Larache lies close to the ruins of Lixus, a town first established as a Phoenician trading post, but which now mainly displays ruins of the Roman era.</p> <p>Further information about the country will be attached in the National Profile form.</p>

Project Topic	Maintenance of the Roman ruins of Chellah, Rabat
Partnership Agreement	This project is the fruit of a partnership between CSM, the Ministry of Education and The Ministry of Youth and Sport.
Relevance of the project	The Chellah ruins are listed as UNESCO World Heritage Site since 2012 and are one of the main archaeological attractions of Morocco. The need of continuous maintenance is huge and we personally consider it a duty to keep it clean and in a good state. The participating volunteers will have the honour to help achieving this task and the opportunity to learn a lot about the culture(s) of this place, which is tightly link with the general history of the Maghreb area.
More info about the Project	Chellah is a UNESCO World Heritage site, meaning its importance extend beyond the history of Morocco, and as the Ministry of Culture and Ministry of Youth and Sports share our belief that it can serve both the place and young people from abroad to develop an archaeological project around the ruins we reached an agreement to make it happen. The roman ruins are well conserved but as any ruins, hands are always needed, this is why we offer the opportunity to young volunteers to come and get to know this precious ancient heritage and at the same time help with its conservation. One part of the volunteers' job will be to assist the staff in charge of Chellah's maintenance with their routine tasks such as cleaning grounds, emptying trash, cleaning and preparing the site for visitors, sweeping and

	<p>blowing walk paths, pruning and watering plants, and sometimes painting spaces if needed and allowed.</p> <p>A second part will be to assist in preserving, inventorying and monitoring natural and cultural resources of the Ruins (plants, animal and archaeological sites).</p> <p>Apart from that, the volunteers can involve in many other activities as they will be in contact with local people and will be able to get to know Moroccan habits and way of life. There will be a camp leader in charge of the general organization and responsibility of the work camp; this person will have the liberty to prepare/propose animations to the participants, such as the visit of any place of interest in the surrounding area or cultural/sportive activities. Of course the volunteers can also take all kind of initiative on their spare-time and propose activities to the group.</p>															
Main Context of the Activity	<p>This work camp is designed to gather national volunteers as well as international ones to lay the emphasis on intercultural exchange through practical and social involvement on both parts. The possibility to befriend and develop ties with the national volunteer will enable the foreigners to get involved in the community not only in the frame of the project but also outside of their working hours.</p> <p>Rabat is the capital and fourth largest city of Morocco with an average population of 580,000 people. It combines both Mediterranean and Oceanic influences on many aspects. Rabat’s climate is mild and temperate, with cool winters and warm summer days. The city is quite dynamic as far as cultural activity is concerned thanks to many structures (Theater Mohammed V right in the city center, Cinema Renaissance, official galleries and the archaeological museum) and active associative work.</p>
