Vive Mexico proudly present to you our 2017-2018 program, and we warmly and friendly invite you to send your motivated volunteers to participate in our workcamps and medium-term projects in Mexico.

All of our projects which have been prepared to bring Mexican culture close to the volunteers bringing also the cultures of the world closer to Latin America; live and build together a great learning experience through International Voluntary Service, promoting the International Cooperation for Development.

All our projects are available for volunteers aged up to 18 years old, we have a wide variety of activities from projects to protect the environment, support of indigenous children, language and training courses, protection of endangered species (Marine Turtles) and promoting cultural exchange through international cooperation and solidarity.

This year we are offering Spanish courses one week previous to the start date of all the projects, the courses are carried out in the city of Morelia, Michoacan, Mexico; the cost is 110 Euros that include: accommodation for 7 days, materials, theory and practice, the duration of the course is 15 hours.

Conditions to participate in our Workcamps and MTV's in Mexico:

- 1. To be older than 18 years.
- 2. To be able to communicate in English (English is the official language of all our projects)
- 3. To speak Spanish is recommended.
- 4. To participate for the whole duration of the project.
- 5. The start date of the project is the welcome day, and the last day is departure day of the project.
- 6. Volunteers should bring sleeping bag and air mat.
- 7. The extra fee must be given to the project leader in Mexican pesos on arrival to the project.
- 8. In the case of projects that have extra fee, the exchange rate is indicated on Vive Mexico's website in the "Exchange" section on our homepage.
- 9. Volunteers will work five days per week followed by two days off, so they can use their leisure time to explore the area and enjoy the different activities that the places where they will stay have to offer.

Project

Since 2014 Vive Mexico has organized this project in Rincon de Guayabitos, Nayarit with extraordinary results, the aim of these projects is to protect sea turtles with a team of biologists working in Guayabitos, Nayarit. A team of biologists who are working with volunteers want to show you the charm of turtle's life.

Work

The working hours are in the night from 20:00 to 8:00, four days per week, this depends on the number of turtles that come ashore, two teams will be split allowing each group to have a day of work, a day off for recovery and two days off in weekends. Some of the activities to be performed are:

- 1. To find adult turtles and collect their eggs.
- 2. To move the eggs to a protected place called Vivero.

- 3. To release newborn baby turtles into the sea.
- 4. To patrol the beaches at night.
- 5. To make some reconstruction in the most important turtle camps from the region.

If you love nature, want to have a great time in beautiful beaches near the village, with all the amenities of a hotel and witness the magic spectacle of nature happenings since millions of years... then this project is for you!
