What You Need To Do

The info-sheet will be sent 1 month in advance. Do read this document at least once before you join the camp. Please be prepared to:

Attend the preparation meeting set up by the sending organization

Use only ENGLISH to communicate when others are around, even if they do not join in the conversation

Be culture-sensitive, especially while in the schools and villages by your behaviour and dress

Share your thoughts and ideas, be creative. Innovative ideas for your work, discussions, campsite, excursions, and free time will make the camp more enjoyable

Understand the values of service and volunteerism

Take the initiative and participate in the various activities that promote "Community Living" in our work camps

Be committed to voluntary work and understand that this is not tourism

Learn the local language. A lot of time will be spent with local people who do not speak English fluently. Communicating in the local language will indicate your interest

Be open-minded, flexible, leave prejudices behind and show initiative

Show responsibility towards your work

Adjust to the way of life in the project and the camp locality

Find that living conditions are often different from home no hot water/airconditioning, no easy access to international phone internet, or no transport all easy the time, insects and mosquitoes etc.



Cost & Duration

FSL- India is a non-profit organisation and does not depend on public or external funding. All costs of FSL- India are sustained through the participation fees from the volunteers. You are therefore expected to pay the participation fee mentioned below, besides all personal expenses for your trip to India (travel/visa/vaccinations etc.)

All work camps conducted by FSL-India last for 2-3 weeks.



These projects are planned in line with a long-term sustainable goal and therefore involve work that is intended to change the lives of many people who deserve special care and attention.



Centre for Experiential Living & 'Agronomics Galore' – Kundapur Open Camp

FSL-India has its very own ecofriendly Centre for Experiental Living (CEL) at Kundapur, in the lush rural area of coastal green, Karnataka, which is home breathtaking fauna and flora. The Centre itself is surrounded by coconut and mango trees, creating an atmosphere of peace and tranquility.

FSL-India's CEL is a home away from home for the program participants all the year around. Your week-long orientation is conducted at the Centre and you will participate in Summer/Winter Camps, as well International Team Leader Trainings (ITLT) here.











Sustainable Agriculture Project Camp Code: FSL-India Open Camp

In August 2014, FSL-India initiated the Sustainable Agriculture Project (SAP) at its newly constructed Centre for Experiential Living at Kundapur, with a vision to evolve a model of sustainable agriculture and livelihood by involving and integrating different farming systems for efficient use conservation and management of natural resources. The Centre has implemented this project across the farm land, which covers 6.5 acres.





Tasks of the program participant:
Depending on the season, you will be engaged in any of the following SAP activities:

- Maintenance of the natural landscape - soil and water conservation, live hedge fencing, fruit and forestry plantation
- Activities in natural surroundings, planning a local food festival, forestcrop cultivation, composting, kitchen garden, medicinal plants cultivation, nursery management
- Express your interests and experience to the farmer, so you can plan how to implement your skills and experience into daily farm life
- Documentation of local traditional practices

Depending on the duration of the program you will also be involved in activities with children in the local schools, i.e. teaching environmental protection through creative learning methods like art, games etc. House visits and meetings with local people will be organized as part of intercultural learning and you will witness and participate in the cultural programs with the local community. The participation fee covers food and accommodation costs.

This small paradise on earth is home to His Holiness, the 14th Dalai Lama and to a significant Tibetan settlement in India. Dharamshala is set in the backdrop of the snow-clad peaks of Dhauladhar Mountains. It is the capital of the Tibetan government-in-exile and the residence of the Dalai Lama.

The Camp

The aim of the project is to provide sanitation and construct a safety wall for the schools and the community. You will help to provide a clean environment for the community, which is being affected by tourist influx and lack of waste management and watershed management systems. You will also create awareness on the Tibetan migrants and their culture.

The 'Zen Life' (cont'd) Activities:

Weeks 1 & 2:

- Promote eco-friendly practices
- Renovation of school buildings and walls, wall painting, educational drawings (murals), teaching basic English
- Cleanup activities at the waterfalls, creating awareness to the community and tourists to support responsible tourism, health and hygiene awareness and tree plantation to avoid landslides
- Participation in Yoga class with professional instructor (only in Wk 1)

Leisure activities:

- Visit various Tibetan institutes to understand the migrants' issues and how the Government is taking care of the migrants
- Interact with monks and the local community to understand the culture

Optional:

During the 3rd week of the camp, the volunteers can participate in a 4-day trekking activity around the mountains of Dharamshala and Triund. The cost for trekking will be Rs.3000/- per pax

Environment / Education / Kids Camp Code: FSL WC-834

Coorg or Kodagu (originally called Kodaimalenadu) means "dense forest on steep hill". It is a rural district located near the city of Mysore (Karnataka State) amongst scenery of misty hills, lush forest, acres and acres of tea, coffee and spice plantations, orange groves, undulating streets and breathtaking views.

The Camp:

Due to the heavy rainfall in Coorg earlier this year, the devastation to the landscape, homes and lifestyle of the local people was tremendous. This time, FSL-India's work camp focuses on rehabilitation of the land of the Kodavas. The activities planned along with local environmental organisations will help to avoid landslides and ensure reforestation as well as environmental protection.

In addition, our volunteers will work with different local NGOs to spread health and hygiene awareness among the tribal villages. This work camp also involves assisting various underprivileged schools by teaching Basic English and Mathematics, Health and Hygiene, physical renovation work like building playgrounds and visiting the nearby Tibetan settlement, farms and estates.

- Participate in wall paintings and educational pictures, construction, teach basic English and spread health and hygiene awareness among the children of the tribal community

Natural Heritage Conservation/Awareness Camp Code: FSL WHV-836, FSL WHV-838

For the last 10 years, FSL-India has been involved in the preservation and conservation of World Heritage Sites, i.e. Hampi, Western Ghats, Mahabalipuram and the Great Himalayan National Park. Established in 1984 and ranging more than 1000 sq km, the park is the natural habitat of numerous flora and fauna, several of which are threatened by extinction. In June 2014, it was added to UNESCO's list of World Heritage Sites due to its outstanding significance in biodiversity conservation.

The Camp

Our volunteers will participate in activities that contribute towards the biodiversity conservation of this beautiful park. Awareness creation on waste management for international/national tourists and locals, cleanup of scenic spots and waterfalls along with the involvement of schoolchildren, a local NGO, the community, park officials, the Archaeological Society of India and the UNESCO World Heritage Centre are all part of this adventure for nature lovers.




Jodhpur is a popular tourist destination featuring many palaces, forts and temples.
